

ANTI-RAGGING POLICY & GUIDELINES

In Compliance with UGC Regulations & Government of India Norms

1. Zero Tolerance Policy

Our institution maintains a **Zero Tolerance Policy** towards ragging. Ragging is a criminal offense as per the Supreme Court of India and UGC Regulations (2009). No act of ragging, major or minor, shall go unnoticed or unpunished.

2. Definition of Ragging

"Ragging is defined as any disorderly conduct, whether by words spoken or written or by an act, which has the effect of teasing, treating, or handling with rudeness a fresher or a junior student. It includes indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which cause or are likely to cause annoyance, hardship, psychological harm, or raise fear or apprehension in a fresher."

3. Punitive Measures

Students found guilty of ragging are liable to one or more of the following punishments:

- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- Debarring from appearing in sessional tests or university examinations.
- Withdrawal of scholarships and other benefits.
- Cancellation of admission or Rustication from the institution (1 to 4 semesters).
- Expulsion from the institution and debarring from admission to any other institution.
- Fine up to **Rs. 25,000/-**.
- Imprisonment for a term which may extend up to two years.
- Collective punishment when the specific perpetrators are not identified.

4. Mandatory Online Undertaking

It is **compulsory** for every student and their parent/guardian to submit an online Anti-Ragging Undertaking Affidavit every academic year.
